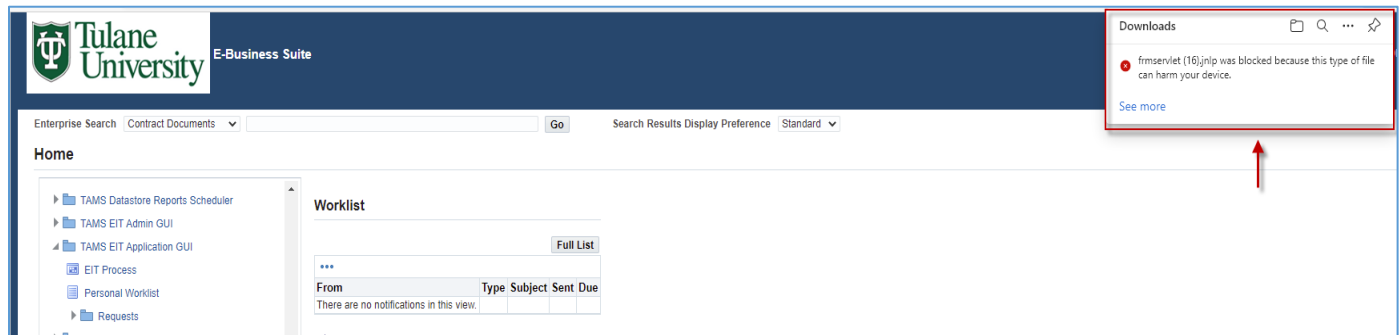


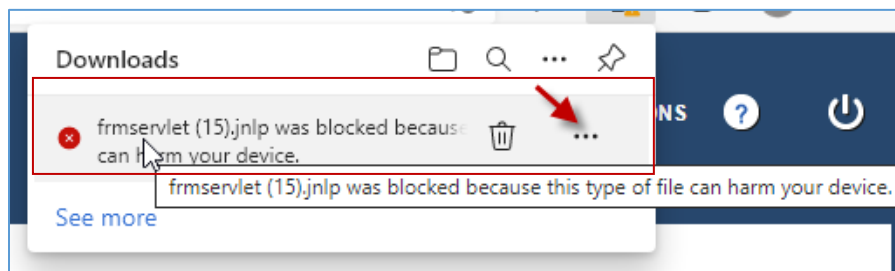
Oracle 12.2: Special Browser Instructions to Initiate Forms/Processes

MICROSOFT EDGE

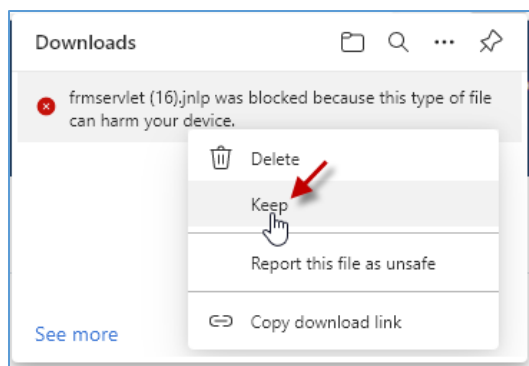
- 1) When you log into EBS and choose a form to open (for example, EIT Process or Project Status), you will be prompted to open a file called frmervlet.jnlp at the top right-hand corner of your screen



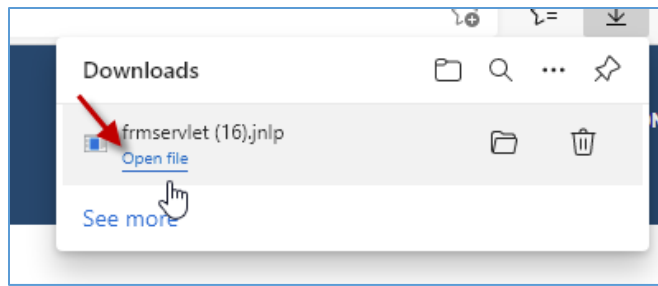
- 2) Hover over the file name until you see the three dots on the right side of the message



- 3) Click the three dots to open the drop-down selection shown below and choose "Keep"

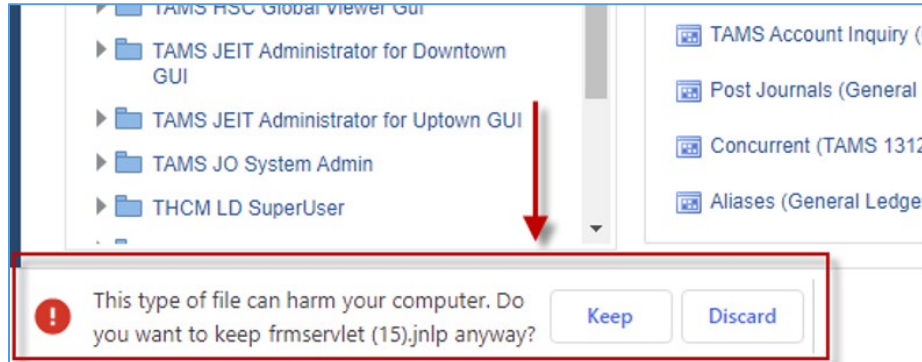


- 4) Click "Open file" to initiate Java which will then automatically open your form

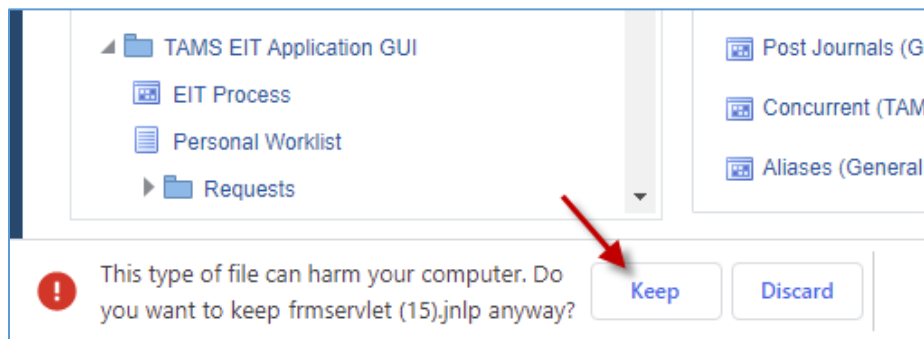


GOOGLE CHROME

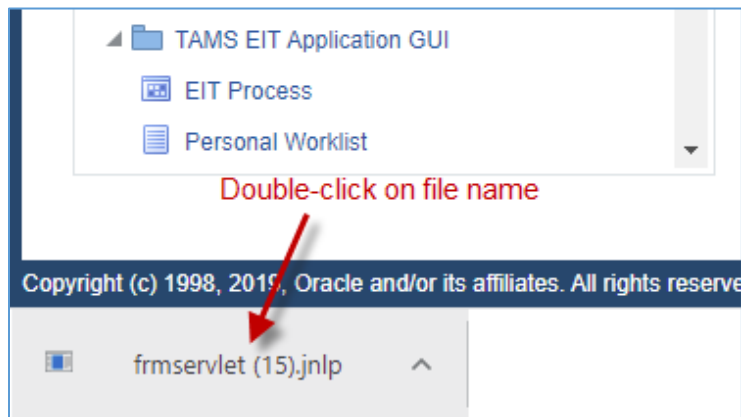
- 1) When you log into EBS and choose a form to open (for example, EIT Process or Project Status), you will be prompted to open a file called frmervlet.jnlp at the bottom left-hand corner of your screen



- 2) Click the Keep button

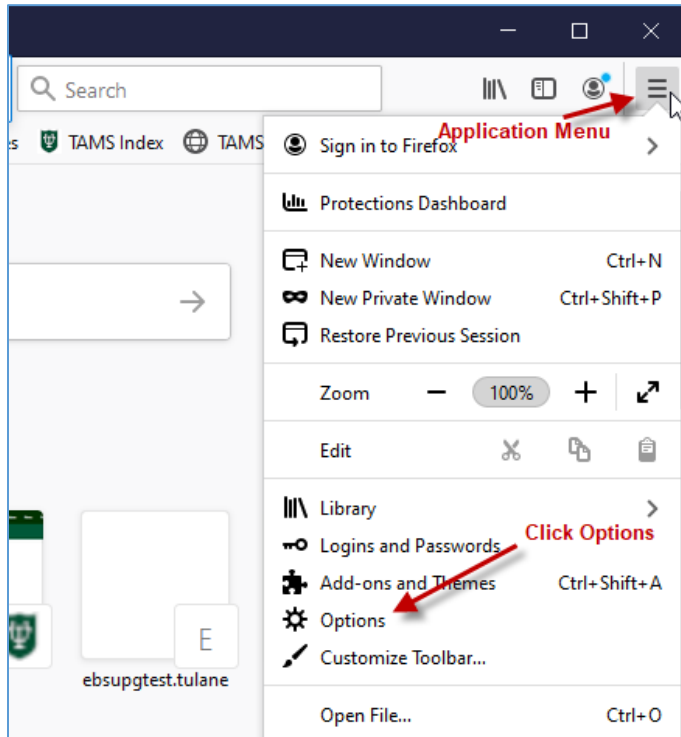


- 3) Double-click on the file name to initiate Java which will then automatically open your form

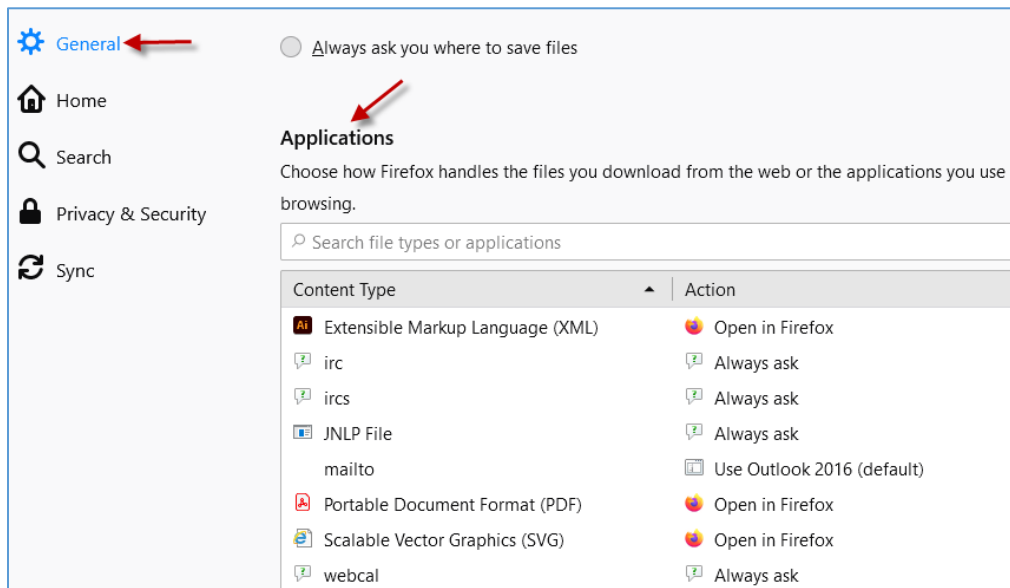


MOZILLA FIREFOX

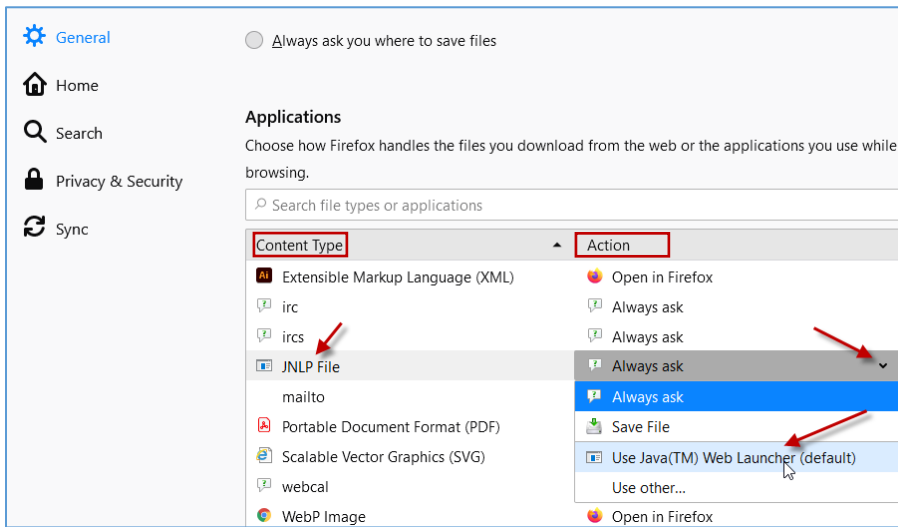
- 1) Before using Oracle EBS 12.2 in Firefox, you will need to make a simple adjustment to your browser settings; this is a one time process that will allow you to open EBS forms in Firefox without having to save the frmervlet file each time you start a session
- 2) Click on the Application Menu (three horizontal lines) at the top right hand corner of the browser screen; click Options from the dropdown menu



- 3) Under the “General” category, scroll down to the “Applications” section

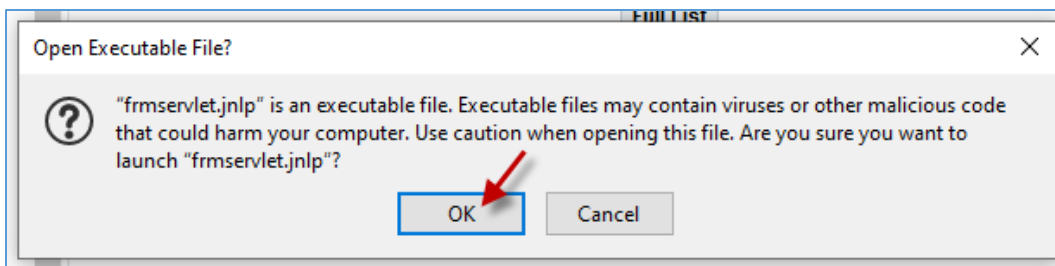


- 4) Under “Content Type,” click on JNLP File, then click on the drop down menu next to it in the “Action” column; choose “Use Java™ Web Launcher (default),” then exit the dialogue box



- 5) The Firefox setting changes detailed above are a one time process that will allow you to open EBS forms in Firefox without having to save the frmervlet file each time you start a session

NOTE: You will receive a warning box each time you start a new session; simply click OK to initiate Java which will automatically open your form



INTERNET EXPLORER

No setup is needed. Just log into Oracle EBS and start up a forms session.
